The boats are not only a thing of beauty but extremely seaworthy and a pleasure to row. The Cora was built in 2011 by the children of Islesford Boatworks, a community-based summer boatbuilding program, and is named after Chummy’s wife.

The 12-foot skiff is lap straked, has oak frame, keel, and stem, with cedar planking. Her planks are joined with bronze rivets. The knees and breast-hook are made from apple wood harvested from the island. Comes with four custom oars so that two people can row at a time, and equipped with a picnic basket and blanket for your adventures. This skiff is a classic and will last a lifetime.

Your gift will bring Acadia to schoolchildren in Maine and around the country, and help Friends of Acadia grow this program in Acadia at a time when federal budget cuts are threatening its existence elsewhere in the country.
