

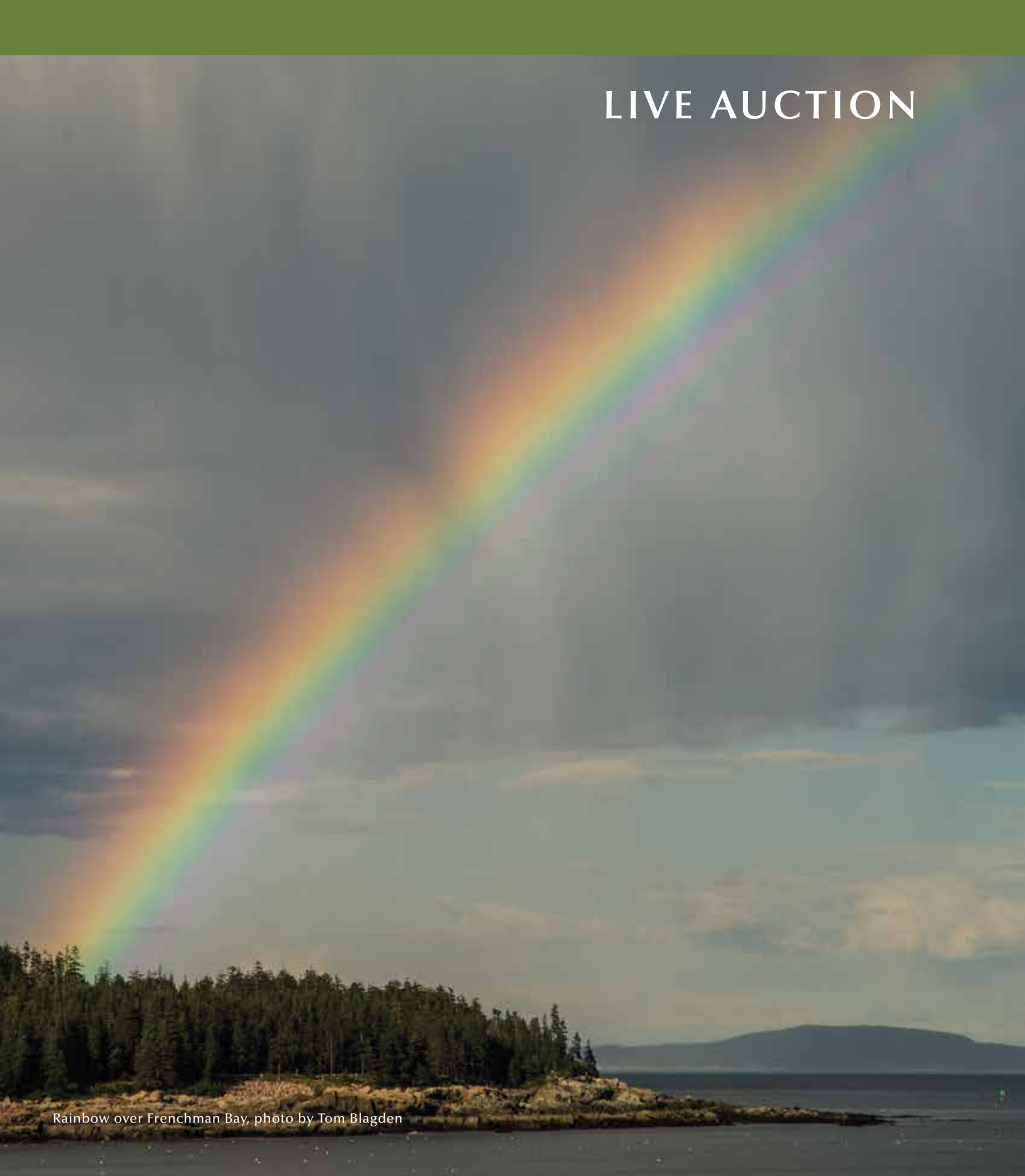

LOT #1

Salzburg, Austria, 50th Anniversary of *The Sound of Music*

Celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the film *The Sound of Music* in Salzburg, Austria. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Salzburg is the birthplace of Wolfgang Mozart and was the filming location for much of the beloved musical.

You and 3 guests will stay at Schloss Leopoldskron, dubbed the “Sound of Music” palace because it was the site of several outdoor scenes in the film and its “Venetian Room” was completely replicated to be used as a setting for the ballroom scene. Built in 1736 and surrounded by 17 acres of manicured grounds, Schloss Leopoldskron features magnificent views of the mountains and of the fortress. In 1918, the Schloss had fallen into disrepair and was purchased by Max Reinhardt, Europe’s most famous theater director and co-founder of the Salzburg Festival. He renovated the Schloss and added several opulent rooms. Today, Schloss Leopoldskron is home to the Salzburg Global Seminar. Karl Lagerfeld chose Schloss Leopoldskron for his December 2014 Chanel fashion show. More information at schloss-leopoldskron.com

Following each day's shoot, liveried servants meet guests at the door of Gillionville's plantation house. 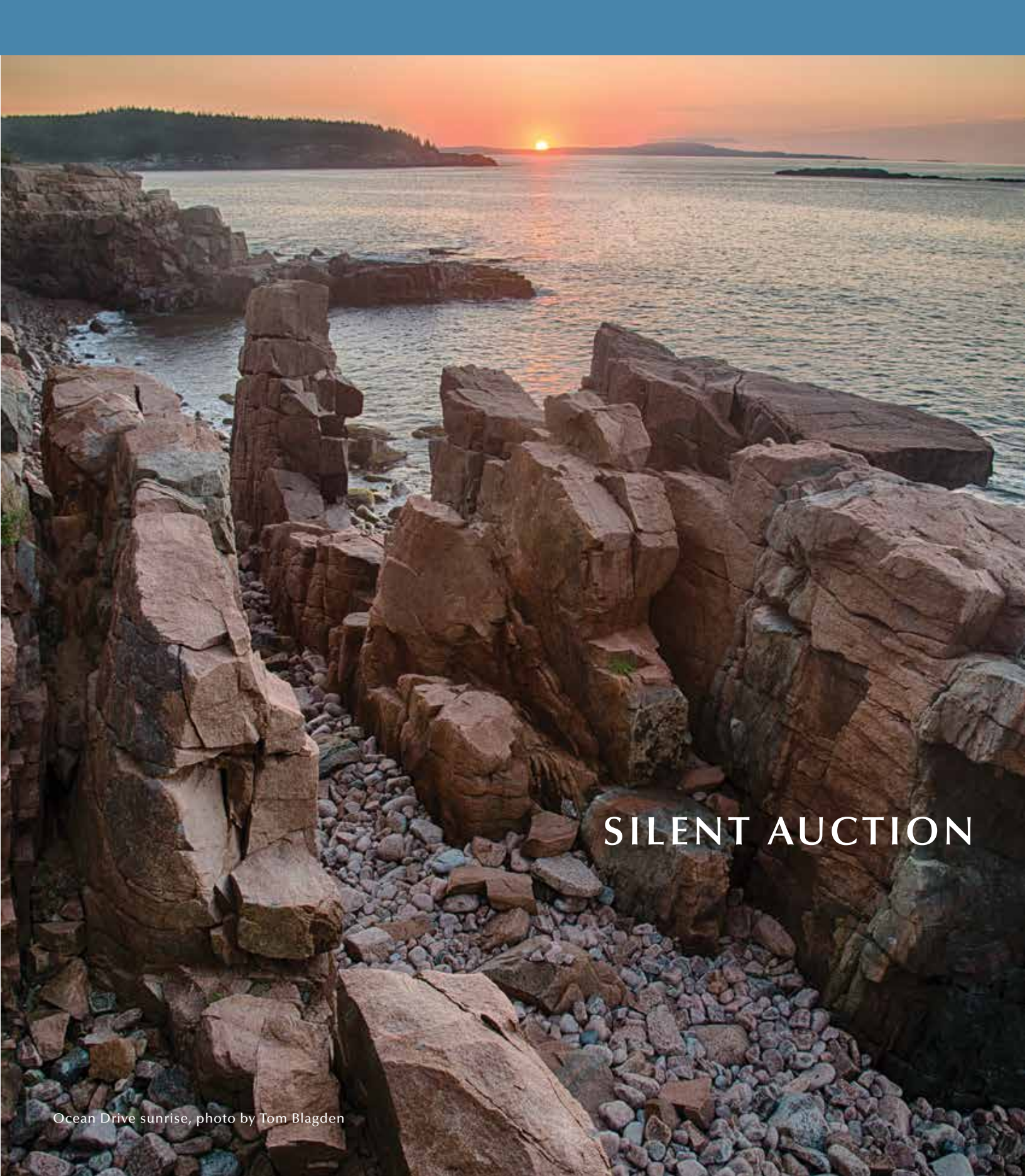
"The carriage roads were built so that more people could be restored to themselves in nature just as I was" —John D. Rockefeller Jr.
