


Dear Friends,

The AYCC is an 8-week, non-residential summer employment opportunity for youth ages 15-18 to work, learn, play, and grow alongside their peers. Youth will accomplish needed conservation projects and gain valuable insight into their environment, including the importance and nuances of conservation. The program is challenging, educational, fun, and offers participants opportunities to expand their horizons while building skills that will benefit them for a lifetime.

Friends of Acadia is hiring a Wild Acadia Coordinator to support the National Park Service, Friends of Acadia, and partners in implementing Wild Acadia, an initiative designed to help Acadia's natural and cultural resources be resilient during an era of



rapid climate change.

The Wild Acadia Coordinator will serve as a link among multiple stakeholders and will manage projects that may include climate-focused habitat restoration, monitoring of target indicators, invasive species removal, vegetation restoration, cultural landscape restoration, and habitat connectivity improvements. The Coordinator will also be responsible for communicating Wild Acadia programs and projects to diverse audiences.

Trails Closed for Peregrine Protection

Jordan Cliffs Trail, Precipice Trail, Valley Cove Trail, and a portion of the Orange & Black Path <u>closed earlier this month</u> to provide peregrine falcons adequate space to nest. These annual closures protect the peregrine falcons from inadvertent human disturbance or harassment during the nesting period.



The National Park Service will reopen the closed areas once park resource managers have determined if peregrine falcon nesting attempts were successful or not.
