
Friends of Acadia saw two significant transitions in 2011: in July our outgoing board chair, Lili Pew, finished her second successful term and passed the baton, and in November president and veteran staff member Marla O'Byrne announced her plans to step down. We thank them for their many contributions, and are glad that Lili remains active on the board and Marla has stayed within our community. We would also like to recognize Diana McDowell for her invaluable stint as interim director in spring of 2012. Fiscally, we had plenty to celebrate in 2011 as once again we finished the year with a positive operating budget while continuing our strong programs and grants for Acadia and the surrounding communities. Cumulative grants topped \$17 million since 1986, the 2011 Annual Benefit broke all records for attendance and funds raised, and our membership climbed above 3,600 for the first time ever. This is a reflection of the tremendous value Acadia has to so many lives, as well as the trust our members, volunteers, donors, and partners place in FOA to responsibly and effectively direct their support to the park's benefit.

As we look to the slopes yet above us, we are grateful for your abiding commitment, which enables us to respond to Acadia's ever-evolving needs. The magnificence of Acadia provides the inspiration and motivation; may it lead you ever upward.

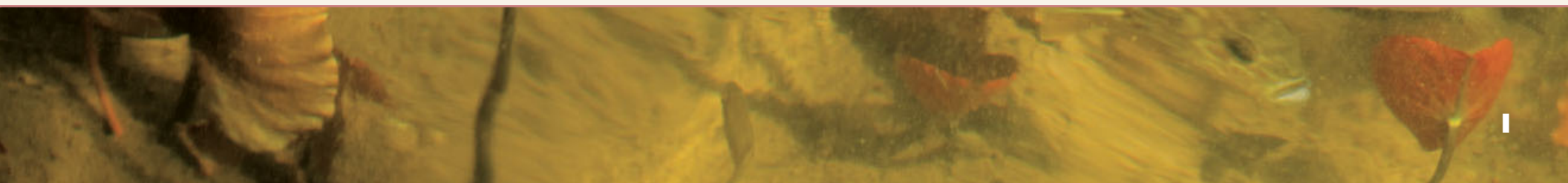

Engaging a Generation

Ten years ago, the sound of a ringing cell phone in the wilderness was still new—maybe even amusing. Amusement has turned to concern, as youthful obsession with all things electronic has begun to pull a whole generation away from the outdoors altogether. When today's youth grow up, will they be moved to nurture and protect natural treasures like Acadia? Friends of Acadia has joined with Acadia National Park to address the dilemma in an innovative and kid-friendly way. Determined to go with—and leverage—the trend rather than fight it, FOA armed a team of four teenagers and their young-adult leaders with iPads, apps, and other digital tools and sent them outdoors in Acadia to explore how youth might use technology to engage with the park and with nature.

The 2011 Acadia Youth Technology Team was designed to generate ideas about how technology could meet two park-wide goals: engaging youth in Acadia and improving the visitor experience. Through a \$25,000 gift in honor of Friends of Acadia's 25th anniversary, FOA hired and equipped four local high school students and an assistant team leader. This funding was matched by the park, which hired the team leader and organized and hosted the program. Friends of Acadia involvement was critical to the success of the program: as an independent organization FOA has flexibility to hire teenaged interns and purchase certain computer equipment, without which, says park interpretive ranger Adrianna MacLane, "the AYTT would have been a very different, and far less successful, program."

The team spent 10 weeks learning about park programs and experimenting with the iPads as well as digital cameras, smart phones, webcams, apps, and QR codes. They met with park employees, researchers, and visitors to discuss the use of technology in the park; hiked miles of trails and carriage roads; brainstormed ideas about how the programs and devices might enhance the outdoor experience of young visitors; and produced a 72-page report that included specific proposals for technology projects, cost breakdowns, incremental development stages, and general principles regarding technology use. The team's conclusions represent a balanced approach to technology in the park. They wrote, for example, "We should not assume providing youth with technology engages them in the park. Instead, we should always specify the specific way youth-targeted technology will encourage stewardship." Plans for the 2012 Acadia Youth Technology Team include implementing selected proposals and developing tools for evaluating the impact of these projects.

In addition to the wealth of ideas the team generated on how to engage youth in nature using technology, this project benefitted the park in two greater senses. On a local level, the Acadia Youth Technology Team was itself a highly successful program to engage youth—the team members—as stewards of Acadia. And on a national level, the project creates a model for how the park service at Acadia and elsewhere can work with young people on similar questions.

The Island Explorer is now a long-running success—the kind that makes it hard to imagine a time when there wasn't a free, environmentally friendly bus service to explore Acadia National Park and the park's surrounding communities.

More than 4 million visitors have proven themselves eager to utilize the service since it was developed and funded with the help of Friends of Acadia, and launched in 1999. In August 2011, a New Jersey family was delighted to find itself the focus of attention as the 4-millionth passengers on the Island Explorer. They had explored a number of different routes during their stay, and they enthusiastically agreed to stop at the Bar Harbor Village Green for a press conference where they were presented with a gift membership to Friends of Acadia and a tote and gift card from L.L.Bean. Overall, the Explorer carried 403,754 passengers in 2011 bringing the total cumulative ridership to 4,114,795 at the end of the operating season.

But the buses need more than just passengers. Administrative and maintenance support—and the funds to pay for these—are vital to the Island Explorer's success. Earlier in the summer, the service's vital role in reducing traffic congestion and maintaining good air quality was again affirmed when L.L.Bean announced it would grant an additional \$1 million to Friends of Acadia to support the bus system over the next five years. Since 2002, L.L.Bean has contributed more than \$3.25 million to FOA to support the buses, along with research fellowships and youth education programs in the park. And some new financial support came from the Ellsworth Area Chamber of Commerce and several Ellsworth businesses, which joined FOA in providing extra operating funds to expand the bus routes with new runs between Ellsworth and Acadia's Hulls Cove Visitor Center.

In the fall, the familiar white, green, and blue buses moved to their permanent home with the completion of the first phase of the Acadia Gateway Center in Trenton. The project got its start in 2007, when FOA purchased 369 acres in Trenton and sold approximately 150 acres to the Maine Department of Transportation to carry forward the center's construction. Phase one houses the bus maintenance facility, a propane fueling station, and administrative offices for Downeast Transportation, the nonprofit operator of the Island Explorer and county-wide transit systems. The building, tucked back well out of sight from Route 3, received LEED gold certification for its design performance in relation to human and environmental health. Future phases of the Acadia Gateway Center will include an intermodal transportation facility and a visitor welcome center.

Continuing the Legacy

Imagine a peaceful evening somewhere in Acadia, maybe deep among the trees, overlooking a still pond, or catching the last rays of sun on a seaside ledge. You hear a light wind in the trees, maybe a few birds calling, or a stream running over moss-covered stones. The sun sets and stars come out, uncountable spangles in the velvety blackness overhead. Far-sighted park founders knew that, although the communities of Mount Desert Island, Schoodic, and Isle au Haut are a special part of the area's appeal, unchecked private development would threaten this sort of natural experience. So they began the legacy of conservation that gave us Acadia National Park.

That work continues today. Privately-held lands within Acadia's boundary or in sensitive areas along its borders threaten the natural soundscapes, vistas, habitats, and dark night skies that contribute to the magic of the visitor experience. In 2011 several land protection milestones were achieved, with the implementation of conservation agreements on a broad tract of land adjacent to the park's Schoodic District and the acquisition of two key parcels within park boundaries.

The Acadia Land Legacy program is a partnership of Friends of Acadia, Maine Coast Heritage Trust (MCHT), and private philanthropists to purchase the remaining privately-held lands within Acadia's legislated boundary and hold those lands until the park is able to acquire them through Land and Water Conservation Fund appropriations. In July, the Acadia Land Legacy partners acquired 17 acres on the northeast shore of Round Pond in the Long Pond watershed. The land had a small cabin and woods cleared down to the pond. Now the cabin will be removed and trees and bushes allowed to grow in, protecting the pond and the remote paddling experience. And in September, Friends of Acadia and Maine Coast Heritage Trust acquired the final 26 of 37 acres along Lower Hadlock Pond from the Mount Desert Water Company (the first 11 acres were purchased in 2010). FOA and MCHT sold a conservation easement on the property to Acadia, protecting a primary water source for Northeast Harbor and an ecologically intact woodland with historic trails that link to the park.

Across Frenchman Bay, 3,200 acres of undeveloped forest and wetland on the Schoodic Peninsula now has a future that promises long-term, sustainable protection. Adjacent to the park, this quiet, unspoiled land is the "gateway" through which all visitors to Acadia's Schoodic District and the Schoodic Education and Research Center (SERC) must pass. Several years ago, the landowner proposed significant changes to the landscape—a major resort—and seemed uninterested in modifying their proposal to address community and park concerns. Throughout this, Friends of Acadia worked to speak up for the public interest and coordinate the response of a coalition of concerned partner organizations. Finally, in late 2011, quiet negotiations led to the sale of the property to a conservation-friendly timberland investment and management organization, Lyme Timber Company. With a financial commitment from Friends of Acadia, MCHT secured an option agreement with Lyme that provides an opportunity for a future conservation easement on the southern portion of the property, bordering Acadia. Together, Lyme Timber Company and the conservation partners are working to create an appropriate future for this precious land.

Accomplishments

WILD GARDENS CELEBRATE A GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY

The Wild Gardens of Acadia celebrated their 50th birthday in 2011, with a summertime lemonade and cake reception at the Gardens and a lecture at College of the Atlantic given by renowned landscape architect Patrick Chassé. Attended by more than 100 people, the lecture focused on the use of native plants in designed landscapes. In 2010, FOA established a formal relationship with Wild Gardens to support the dedicated work of the Wild Gardens volunteers and ensure stability for this ¾-acre gem, which today nurtures and displays over 400 plants native to Acadia.

ADVOCATES GO TO CONGRESS

With possible 10 percent cuts to the National Park Service budget looming last year, Friends of Acadia engaged its board members, trustees, and several donors to call and visit with members of Congress. In the spring, FOA staff and board members joined Acadia Superintendent Sheridan Steele for meetings on Capitol Hill, sharing information with the Maine delegation and other Congressional offices about how proposed budget cuts would affect Acadia's operations and land acquisition projects. FOA also attended meetings with other national park friends groups to highlight the power of philanthropy in leveraging Congressional appropriations to accomplish national park projects. By all accounts, the effort was helpful, and the National Park Service operating budget was reduced by only 1.5 percent for 2012.

ACADIA LEADS IN DARK-SKY PROTECTION

Celebration and public awareness of Acadia's night sky as a treasured resource was the centerpiece of the third annual Acadia Night Sky Festival in September, co-sponsored by Friends of Acadia. Although fog canceled several outdoor activities, the arts events and lectures drew rave reviews. Throughout the summer, Friends of Acadia helped the park to assess just how night-sky friendly it is, with a grant for an internship to inventory the park's lighting systems. The inventory found that 41 percent of the park's lights are either full-cut-off fixtures or fully shielded and therefore help protect night skies. The park aims for the 66 percent required by the International Dark-Sky Association to achieve "International Dark Sky Park" designation.

NEW MEMBERS SIGN UP

Many who visit Jordan Pond House for tea and popovers (or as a departure point for hiking, biking, and other adventures) also take advantage of Friends of Acadia's membership table, a fixture at the Acadia hotspot since 2007. Of the 750-plus members who joined FOA in 2011, about a third joined at Jordan Pond House, and the membership table with its staff of enthusiastic FOA member-volunteers took in \$17,922 in contributions from new members and others. The program has proven an excellent opportunity to share the Friends of Acadia story one-on-one with visitors, who often express eagerness to join FOA as a way to give back to Acadia. The table is also convenient for membership renewals.

RIDGE RUNNERS EDUCATE, STUDY, AND PROTECT

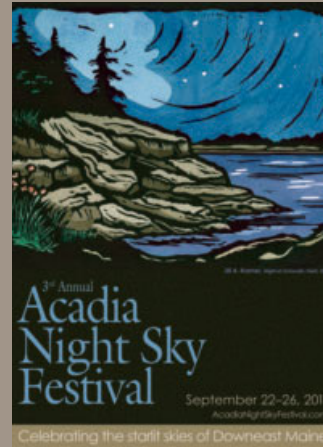
Hikers in Acadia can be confident that they will easily find the next cairn or other trail-marker, thanks to the ongoing work of the Ridge Runners and Recreation Technician. Funded by Friends of Acadia and trained by park staff, the Ridge Runners contacted 4,597 visitors with Leave No Trace messages in 2011, constructed or rebuilt 645 cairns, dismantled 382 misleading or visitor-built structures, administered 400 visitor survey cards, and conducted 48 summit censuses. They served as FOA field ambassadors and helped visitors with trail directions and other needs while encouraging them to be good stewards for the park.

YOUTH FIND TRAIL WORK REWARDING

Once again, 16 high school students spent summer in Acadia and helped maintain park resources with the Acadia Youth Conservation Corps. Working with four National Park Service leaders, they assisted park trail crews and volunteers in rehabilitating trails in the Bowl and Beehive area, Flying Mountain, the A. Murray Young Path, the Kane and Canon Brook area, the Bubbles, and one of the park's newest trails, the Kebo Brook Connector. The AYCC also helped keep drainage open on the carriage roads, split wood for the campgrounds, and cut brush. The crew spent a morning showing their parents their work along the Kane Path, and they were able to attend other special events in the park including a youth summit and interpretive hikes.

Accomplishments

WINTER GROOMING EARNS HIGH PRAISE

The Acadia Winter Trails Association volunteers moved mountains of snow to set cross-country ski tracks during the super-snowy winter of 2010–2011. The 18 volunteers put in 650 hours, reaping numerous messages of thanks from skiers, who also left donations to the grooming program in envelopes provided at two trailheads. One wrote: “We had some great skiing on the trails this winter! Our thanks for excellent grooming!” Coordinated and funded by FOA, and using four snowmobiles and nearly a dozen grooming track setters maintained by the park, AWTA grooms classic and skating tracks on the carriage roads of Acadia.

STUDENTS HELP CLEAN UP

More than 575 volunteers participated in Friends of Acadia’s 11th Earth Day Roadside Cleanup. 2011 was FOA’s biggest volunteer year ever, including a large contingent of schools from MDI and Ellsworth, and dozens of participating businesses and organizations. Volunteers collected more than 770 bags of trash (about 3.3 tons) from 175 miles of road in the MDI, Ellsworth, Trenton, and Schoodic areas.

CONNECTOR TRAILS ENHANCE HIKES

New trails are providing more options for exploring the wild world both in Acadia and surrounding communities. In 2011, construction was completed of the ¾-mile Duck Brook Connector Trail, which connects Route 3 in Bar Harbor to the Duck Brook Road near the popular Duck Brook Bridge entrance to the carriage roads. Open to foot traffic, including bicycles walked (but not ridden), it replaces a social trail that was not open to the public. This new trail completes the Acadia Trails Forever goal of five new village connector trails. In addition, FOA continued working with a committee in Trenton to build the 1.8-mile Trenton Community Trail, behind the Acadia Gateway Center off Route 3. With the help of dozens of volunteers, the project will expand outdoor recreation and provide educational access to heath and forest habitats.

TREMONT SPRUCES UP COMMUNITY TRAIL

Friends of Acadia and the town of Tremont hosted a spring cleanup of the Al Butler Memorial Trail in Tremont. The trail, built in 2007, was in need of care and upkeep. Volunteers, led by FOA staff and volunteer crew leaders, removed litter; “grubbed out” new sections of trail, and laid woodchips. The ¾-mile loop starts behind the Tremont Town office parking area, loops around a lovely field, runs along an outlet of the Bass Harbor marsh, and borders Acadia National Park.

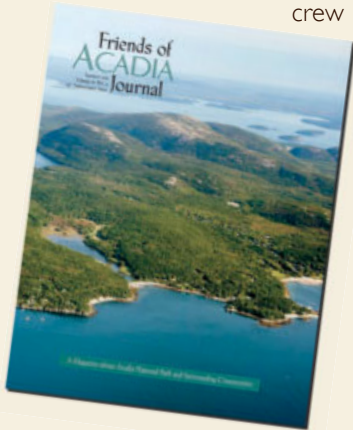
VOLUNTEERS LEAD THE WAY

Along with a slideshow, commemorative program, and (of course!) birthday cake, the annual meeting featured speaker Anna Adams, FOA’s newest field crew leader and a dedicated young conservationist.

Adams said her first job, with the Acadia Youth Conservation Corps, set the course of her life and that she leaped at the chance to return to the FOA family: “Nothing could be better than getting to help others work in this beautiful place, and get to know it for themselves.” The 25th anniversary celebrations generated plenty of excitement for the future of Friends of Acadia.

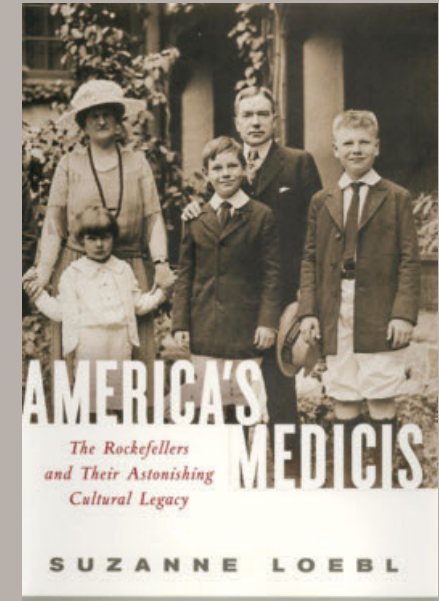
Acadia Society Event

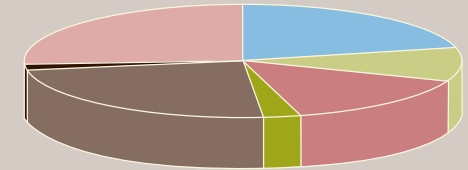
