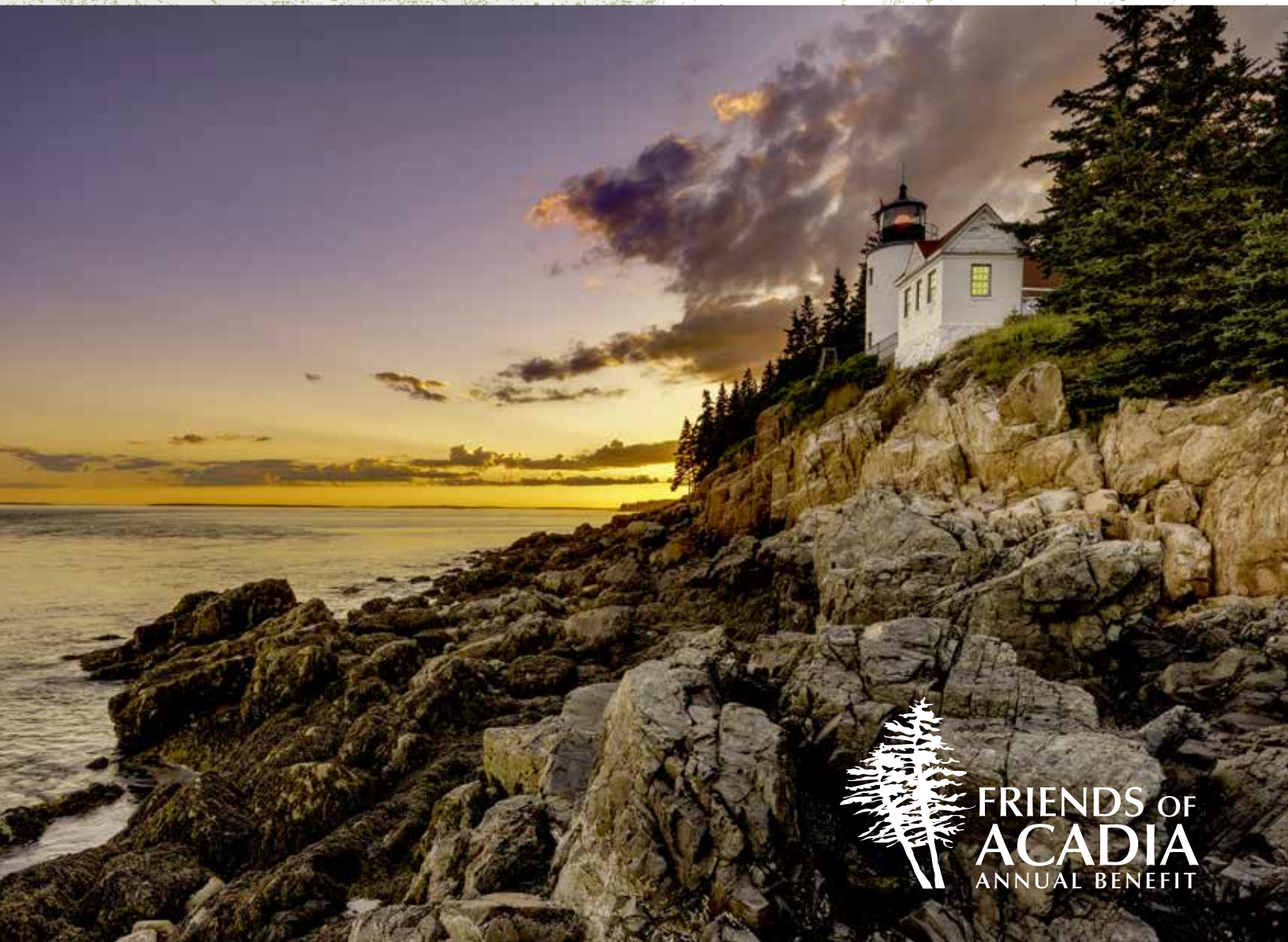



With Friends of Acadia’s help, the park will improve visitor access and educational opportunities at the site, ensuring this cultural treasure is well maintained for generations to come. 

With custom twin MAN, 12 cylinder, 1360 horsepower engines you could easily visit Isle Au Haut, Frenchboro, Matinicus, Vinalhaven, or head up the coast toward the Roque Island or the bold coast. Perhaps you will design a lighthouse tour or simply enjoy gunkholing around the waters close to MDI – whatever you choose, this will be your day to design with the boat captain. *Sea Smoke* will be fully stocked with top shelf food and beverages, and catered service for a lunch or dinner around the dining table. It began its life in Paris, shuttling the head of Revlon through the French streets before being shipped to New York. In the 1980's George Hambleton brought the car to Maine where he enjoyed exploring the motor roads of Acadia each summer. The car is one of a dozen cars that feature a caning or basket weave paint finish, making it stand out among its Mini contemporaries. It has been serviced locally at MDI Imported Car Service and includes 4 extra wheels and snow tires.

The Bass Harbor Head Light, built in 1858, is perhaps the most iconic of all the lighthouses along the coastline of Acadia. Most visitors have assumed the lighthouse is part of Acadia National Park—but in fact, it has long been a park in-holding administered by the U.S. Coast Guard. Now, the park has the opportunity to acquire, restore, and repurpose the Bass Harbor Head Light and 2 ½ acre property to expand educational opportunities and improve visitor access, but it will require help from those of us in the community.

Because the park does not have a dedicated budget for this undertaking, Friends of Acadia, and donors like you, can play an important role in helping to make this transformation possible. Your gift will help ensure the iconic Bass Harbor Head Light becomes a permanent cultural and educational resource in Acadia National Park, to be enjoyed for generations to come.

Bulkhead from George Dorr's Bar Harbor Estate, Old Farm at Compass Harbor



When George Dorr passed away, his family's estate in Bar Harbor – Old Farm – was bequeathed to Acadia National Park. The structures on the property were taken down in the late '40s, hiking trails were built, and over the years the property, known as Compass Harbor, has become a unique and favorite destination in Acadia. One of the estate's structures, a bulkhead, was acquired by Peter Liscomb's father, Horace, and has been in his family ever since. FOA Trail Shop Volunteers have stabilized the structure, preserving its historic character for one lucky bidder. It could be repurposed as a garden shed, playhouse for children, or simply a historic accent to your home.
