

Paddle Raise: A New Boat for Acadia!

Acadia National Park is known for the striking and complex patchwork of park lands across Mount Desert Island, the Schoodic Peninsula, and Isle au Haut. The park also currently holds conservation easements on 184 properties in 18 towns, most of which are on offshore islands, only accessible by boat. This boat, a landing craft, will allow for the unloading of people and equipment directly on the shore for maintenance, resource management, and law enforcement. It will reduce personnel time and provide ample seating and cargo space. And newer, modern marine engines burn cleaner, and more efficiently. Acquiring the funding to purchase an upgraded vessel would allow the park to have a safer and more functional boat that enables direct beach access to just about any island. Let's raise our paddles this August!

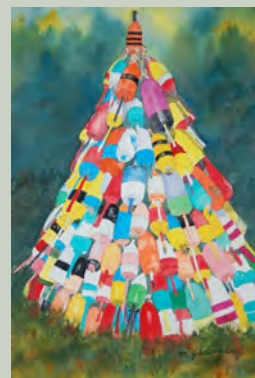
