Happy Spring! Acadia's mountainsides and valleys are bursting with spring color, and our seasonal programs and events are springing back to life, too! Last month, nearly 260 volunteers collected 300 bags of roadside trash at Friends of Acadia's 23rd Annual Earth Day Roadside Cleanup, and last week volunteers helped park staff remove storm debris from the Schoodic and Seawall Picnic Areas.

This time of year is inspiring as we see our local communities spring into collective action to give back with their time and energy, and the park readies for peak visitor season.

Wild Gardens of Acadia Plant Sale June 15

Continuing a decades-long tradition, the Wild Gardens of Acadia will hold their plant sale this June. Help support the Wild Gardens by shopping at the sale on June 15 from 9 a.m. to noon at Saint Saviour's Episcopal Church in Bar Harbor. Cash and checks will be accepted.



The plant sale will be smaller this year as we are taking measures to try to prevent the spread of jumping worms (genus *Amyntas*), which are detrimental to soil health and the forest floor.

Proceeds from the sale fund the maintenance and operations of the Wild Gardens of Acadia at Sieur de Monts in Acadia National Park. The Gardens are open daily from dawn to dusk and display more than 400 native plants in habitats that represent those found in the park.

Thanks to the incredible volunteers who pitched in last week to help the park clean up at Schoodic and the



Seawall picnic area following the winter's intense storms.

At Schoodic, volunteers moved large amounts of cobbles and marine debris to the inland side of the road. Many of the cobbles were encroaching upon wetland habitat and blocking culverts, and thus can't be removed by heavy machinery.



At Seawall, many trees fell within the picnic area and volunteers helped remove the fallen trees after they were processed by the Acadia maintenance staff.

The Acadia Storm Damage Giving Challenge

As you may know, Acadia suffered significant damage in certain coastal areas of the park during a series of intense winter storms earlier this year. Park staff are assessing the damage and applying for federal funding to help, but related repairs are anticipated to exceed \$20 million and federal funding is NOT guaranteed.



When Kay and Bill Koplovitz heard the news, they contacted Friends of Acadia with an offer to [match any new gifts of support up to \\$100,000](#). So, we're inviting members and friends to help us meet this challenge.
