#### Defending Acadia Against Industrial-Scale Aquaculture

Friends of Acadia recently authored an opinion piece published in several Maine newspapers, including the <u>Maine Sunday Telegram</u>. The piece expressed concerns about the 60acre salmon farms that American Aquafarms has proposed near Long Porcupine Island and Bald Rock in Frenchman Bay.



At approximately the size of fifteen football fields, the farms would be an industrial use at an unprecedented scale. They would permanently degrade the park's scenic vistas, clean air, natural soundscapes, and visitor experience. Read more <u>here</u>.

## Congressional Delegation Visits Acadia to Discuss Climate Change

A delegation from the U.S. House of Representatives Sustainable Energy and Environment Coalition visited Acadia National Park last week to explore issues surrounding climate change with scientists from the park, Schoodic Institute, and Friends of Acadia. Four U.S. Representatives and staff donned rain gear on Thursday to visit the Schoodic



Peninsula, Sieur de Monts, Thunder Hole, Jordan Pond, and Cadillac Mountain.

Participating officials included: Reps Chellie Pingree (ME) and Mike Quigley (IL)—vice chairs of the coalition, Nanette Barragan (CA), and Annie Kuster (NH).

The purpose of the visit was to learn firsthand from park scientists and natural resource managers how climate change is affecting Acadia, and what needs to be done to protect it for future generations. Read more <u>here</u>.

## Take Pride in Acadia Day 2021

Take Pride in Acadia Day is Saturday, November 6. Like last year, the event will be modified to increase safety due to COVID-19. The event will run at about 50% capacity, with groups meeting at work locations rather than park headquarters. Participants who wish to participate can pre-register in teams of people with whom they feel comfortable working outdoors. For example, a team of 8-16 people may consist of family friends students out



consist of family, friends, students, outing clubs, etc.

Friends of Acadia and Acadia National Park staff will distribute tools and other supplies to groups ahead of the event. On the day of the event, teams will meet at a predetermined location along the carriage road system. Team registrations will be processed in the order they are received.

## Summit Steward End-of-Season Presentation

Join the Friends of Acadia Summit Stewards as they recap their 2021 season and share personal highlights and observations from their work. Summit Stewards hike Acadia's trails and summits, answer visitor questions, conduct basic trail maintenance, repair cairns, remove visitor-built cairns and rock art, respond to emergencies,



communicate with park managers, and collect data about weather, car and bus traffic, visitor use, and visitor behavior.
