## Wild Gardens Plant Sale This Weekend!

Help support the Wild Gardens of Acadia by shopping the Wild Gardens of Acadia Plant Sale on **June 17, 2023, from 9 a.m. to noon**.

The plant sale will be held at St. Saviour's Episcopal Church in Bar Harbor and will feature annuals and perennials, vegetable seedlings, native



plants, house plants, and ferns. There will be options to add color to your garden or bring some green into your home. Cash and checks are accepted.

Proceeds from the sale fund the maintenance and operations of the Wild Gardens of Acadia at Sieur de Monts in Acadia National Park. The Gardens (now reopened after significant spring flooding) display more than 400 native plants in habitats that represent those found in the park and are open daily from dawn until dusk.

Mountain with a bag of soil Wednesday, June 21,
2023. Advanced registration is required!



Acadia National Park, in collaboration with its partners-in-science Friends of Acadia and Schoodic Institute, invites tenacious hikers to carry bags of soil to



the summits of Penobscot and Sargent Mountains. You'll get to choose how much soil you'll carry – carrying as little as five pounds (about the size of a large freezer ziplock bag) is a huge help!

This soil is integral to the <u>ongoing summit restoration</u> efforts in Acadia National Park.
