Friends of Acadia is seeking a nonpartisan Government Affairs Manager to advance the priorities of the organization's strategic plan and support Acadia National Park through legislative activities, networking, communications, and advocacy. Subject areas include national park appropriations, climate change,



transportation issues, tribal collaboration, outdoor youth engagement, and diversity, equity, and inclusion.

The Government Affairs Manager will also develop Friends of Acadia's response to threats to Acadia, such as inappropriate adjacent development and air, water, light, and noise pollution.

The Government Affairs Manager will establish relationships with local, state, and federal officials, identify, monitor, and advance policies of interest, and prepare

organizational position statements.


