Acadia National Park is seeking your feedback about a proposal to improve the ecological health of the Great Meadow by restoring natural function to the wetland and Cromwell Brook.

The Great Meadow Restoration Project proposes to: restore wetland ecosystem function, improve wildlife passage and connectivity along Cromwell Brook, improve downstream



channel morphology, build resiliency and ecological adaptability to the ecosystem, enhance the recreational experience for visitors, reduce damage and maintenance to infrastructure and facilities, and more.
